Easter: A Season of Resurrection and Joy

Easter marks the pinnacle of the Christian calendar. It commemorates the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, signifying victory over sin and death. But Easter is not merely a single day; it unfolds into a season of celebration and renewal.

The Great Fifty Days of Eastertide

- 1. **Easter Sunday**: The festivities begin on Easter Day itself. Known as the **Great Fifty Days** or **Eastertide**, this period extends for **fifty days**—a time of continuous feasting and joy. The acclamation "Alleluia" is used often in liturgical worship in this season when the Church year reaches its zenith.
- Historical Roots: The word "Lent" (meaning spring) leads up to Easter. Lent's 40 days symbolize Jesus' wilderness fast. But after Lent, the Church enters a season of abundance. The Great Fifty Days mirror the biblical themes of liberation, restoration, and renewal.
- 3. **The Number Fifty**: Why fifty? It holds deep significance:
 - Moses and Mount Sinai: The 40 days of Lent parallel Moses' 40 days on Mount Sinai, where he received the Ten Commandments. The additional 10 days symbolize the journey from Sinai to the Promised Land.
 - Jubilee: In the Old Testament, the Jubilee occurred every 50 years—
 a time of release, restoration, and freedom. Similarly, the Great Fifty Days
 invite us to experience spiritual liberation.
- 4. **Easter Vigil to Pentecost**: During these fifty days, there is no fasting. Instead, we stand in prayer, celebrating the risen Christ. The season culminates in **Pentecost**, the 50th day, when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples. It's a moment of empowerment and mission.

A Time of Renewal and Abundant Life

As Anglicans, we embrace the Great Fifty Days with joy. We sing, "Triumphant in his glory now, his scepter ruleth all, earth, heaven, and hell before him bow." The resurrection isn't confined to Easter Sunday—it reverberates through these days, transforming hearts and renewing faith.

So let us journey through this Eastertide, savouring the victory of Christ, anticipating the Holy Spirit's fire, and sharing in the abundant life He offers. Easter isn't just a day; it's a season of resurrection that invites us to participate fully in God's redemptive work.

Helen Pearson, Church Warden, delivered the eggs – well done to Helen and all who donated the eggs.


St. Michael's Men's Fellowship Group

Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM): A Vital Gathering

The **APCM** is a crucial event in the life of an Anglican parish. Here's what you need to know:

1. Purpose and Timing: This year it is on Sunday 21st April in the church at 11.30 a.m.

 It serves as a forum for parishioners to come together, discuss important matters, and make decisions.

2. Agenda:

- Electoral Roll: The meeting receives reports on changes to the electoral roll—the list of eligible voters within the parish.
- General Parish Activities: Reports cover various aspects of parish life, including worship, outreach, and community engagement.
- Financial Matters: The financial health of the parish is discussed, including budget updates and stewardship.
- Elections: New members are elected to the Parochial Church Council (PCC) and the deanery synod (every three years).

3. Legal Framework:

- The legal aspects of convening and running the APCM are outlined in Part 9, section A of the Church Representation Rules 2022.
- o These rules provide guidelines for conducting meetings, eligibility, and procedures.

4. Electoral Roll:

- The Electoral Roll is revised annually.
- Every sixth year, a new roll is prepared, requiring everyone to reapply for inclusion.
- Names can be added throughout the year, but removals happen only during the annual revision.

5. Forms and Notices:

- The APCM requires specific forms and notices:
 - Notice of the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (Form 1): Provides essential details about the meeting.
 - Nomination Forms: Used for electing churchwardens, PCC members, and deanery synod representatives.

6. Spirit of Participation:

- The APCM is open to all parishioners.
- o It's a time to engage, share insights, and actively participate in the life of the church.
