Being ORDINARY

How many times today have you seen an advert which promises to make you stand out from the crowd by buying their product, that you are someone special? How many films we watch start with some discovering they can do something that nobody else can... be it a super agent, a superhero or super smart? But if you're anything like me most of the time you just feel ordinary. The other day I was commuting into London on the train, suited and booted, just one of many. Ordinary.

BUT ORDINARY IS POWERFUL

But I am at a crossroads, as a deacon (literally, a servant) my role is not to stand out but to serve, in some ways just to be ordinary and kind. I will be ordained a priest in a few weeks time, but I will remain an ordinary deacon, and hopefully I will remain kind.

When I wear my collar, people see a clergyperson. One of many. When I do good, when I am kind, it reflects well on the church. My hope is it increases people's view that the church is somewhere they can come to on their spiritual journey. When they do so, they will (hopefully) meet other ordinary clergy who also do good and are kind. But perhaps people expect me to be this way because I wear a collar?

What if we all are kind, we all show love, like Christ did, like Christ commands us to "love one another". Lots of ordinary people, but spreading love rather than doing nothing. Imagine when people realise that it's not just a few rare individuals, but lots of ordinary people. It might be someone simple, like smiling and saying hello to a fellow train passenger. It might be offering to help carry some shopping or help loading it into their car when I'm at the supermarket.

In this hurting and confused world, people need to know the love of Christ is still present. One or two rare occurrences of seeing love and kindness is better than none... ...but imagine if it becomes ordinary to show love, to show kindness! That changes society.

SHINING A LIGHT AT ST MICHAEL'S

It has become apparent to the Parochial Church Council recently that the electrical installation in the church is reaching the end of its safe life, and that urgent steps need to be taken to remedy the situation. At the same time, we are conscious that lighting conditions in St Michael's are far from perfect, and undertaking significant work now gives us the opportunity to install a much more appropriate system. We have engaged electrical contractors CES Lighting of Wallington, Surrey, who have a history of successful involvement in such projects, and the Council has accepted a tender of some £91,000. Sums of money put aside for use only on the building come close to the figure, but we cannot risk using everything we have, which is why we are asking for your help. VAT will be payable but can be reclaimed under the government's Listed Places of Worship scheme, provided we finish the work in the current tax year. To get our fund-raising under way, we have been fortunate to have the following offer from Mike Parkinson, for which we are very grateful. The presentation is on Saturday 12 July at 7.30pm.
